This thirteenth annual crop report is the average gross prices received by the farmers of this county for their commodities.

This year there was a \$3,577,626.33 reduction in the over-all income which was mostly due to the drop in the production of lumber with the closing down of the Westwood Mill. Apiary products doubled in value, as there was a large increase in the number of colonies brought into the county.
