

Section 65.5 of the California Agriculture Code requires that the Agricultural Commissioner compile a report covering the conditions, acreage, production, and value of the agricultural products of his county.

This fifteenth annual crop report is the average gross prices received by the farmers of this county for their commodities.

With the help of the State Bureau of Agricultural Statistics we have changed this report in form, so that progress toward county uniformity could be achieved within reason.

Lumber and some of the other commodities will not be included in the grand total, but shown separately. Cattle showed a marked increase of two million which was due to an increase in cattle prices, and more cattle being moved to market. A considerable number of wild horses were rounded up, and shipped for chicken feed.

We wish to express our sincere appreciation to those who helped to make the compilation of this report possible.
