## **DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES**

Transportation of clients from the Behavioral Health Department, Family and Child Protective Services Department, and/or other Social Services Departments to and from various appointments, treatment facilities and hospitals. The major duties of the job include:

- Ability to operate a County vehicle to transport clients of all ages to and from various locations.
- Assist clients with loading and unloading of items.
- Research and plan for traffic, construction and weather delays.
- Ensure car seats are clean and in good operating order before and after transport.
- Interact with clients in a professional manner at all times.
- Work on-call for emergencies; work on weekends.
- Occasional child care.
- Report any vehicle issues and request service.
- Arrange and Perform regular cleaning of fleet vehicles.
- Keep mileage records up to date, as required.
- Excellent navigation skills and proficiency in using navigation applications to find delivery locations
- Time management and organizational skills to keep track of deliveries and stay on schedule
- Exceptional communication and interpersonal skills to interact with clients
- Perform other duties as assigned.

## MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS

Any combination of experience and training that would provide the required knowledge and abilities is qualifying. A typical way to obtain the required knowledge and abilities would be:

#### Experience and training:

Equivalent to the completion of the twelfth grade. Be 21 years of age at the time of appointment.

#### Licenses and Certifications

Possession of, or ability to obtain, a California Class C driver's license with a good driving record and must be insurable under the County's Insurance Policy.

Current CPR and First Aid Cards (may be obtained at time of hire).
